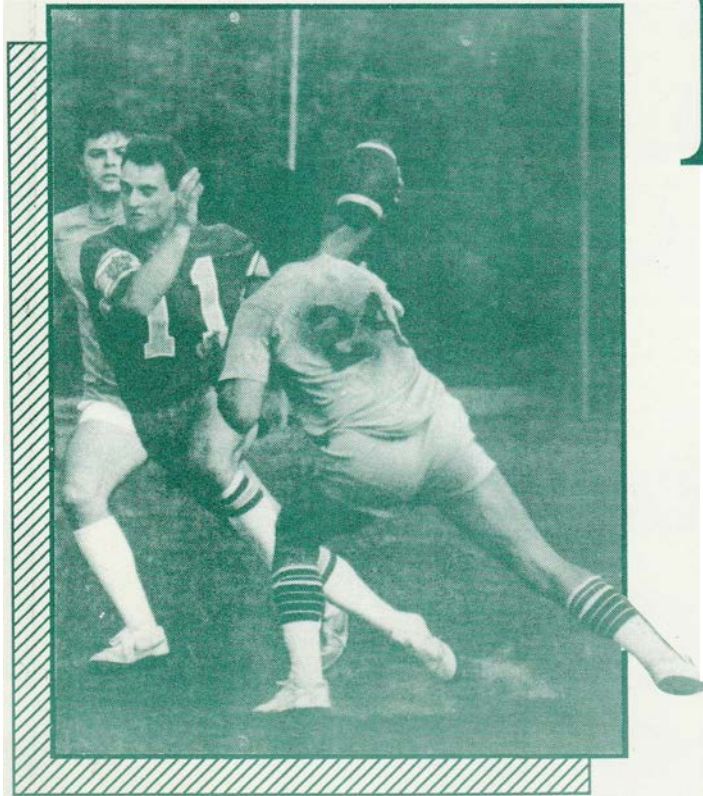

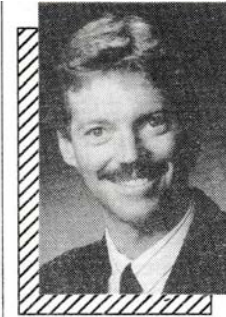

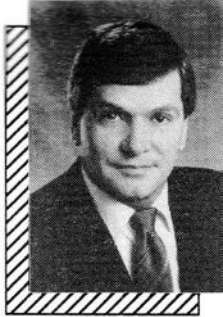

GENERAL RULES

TOURNAMENT PLAYING RULES

Tournament playing rules will be governed by the Football Canada Touch Football Rule Book except as noted below.

PRE-GAME PROCEDURES

Teams should arrive at the designated playing field at least fifteen minutes prior to the scheduled starting time of the game.

NOTE: Scheduled starting time means the time indicated on the published tournament schedule drawn up prior to the start of play.

The team line-up shall be filled in on the game score card prior to the start of the game. The list shall include the surname or each player with usual first name and uniform number.

GAME DEFAULT

Game defaults will be administered as per Rule 6.9 of the Rule Book except that the Tournament Schedule Coordinator, in consultation with the Game Site Coordinator, will make the final decision regarding defaults, not the game Referee.

LENGTH OF GAMES

- a) Except as noted in b) below, all games will be 60 minutes in length comprised of four quarters of 15 minutes each. The "five play rule" will be invoked at the 12 minute mark of the 2nd and 4th quarters. Half-time will be 5 minutes or less, whichever is agreeable to both teams and the Referee. Teams will be allowed one time out per half, as per the Rule Book.
- b) The following games will be 80 minutes in length, with the "five play rule," half-time and time outs as per the Rule Book:
 - i) Intermediate Men's A Division Championship Game
 - ii) Intermediate Men's AA Division Championship Game
 - iii) Masters' Division Championship Game, the game preceding the Championship Game
 - iv) Women's Open Division Championship Game, the two games preceding the Championship Game
 - v) Senior Men's Division Championship Game, the two games preceding the Championship Game
- c) There will be no mercy rule applied to any game.

OVERTIME

Games tied after regulation time will use the following tie breaking procedures:

- a) After 60 minutes, a "penetration" game of 5 plays each team will be played as per Regulation 5.3 of the Rule Book; there will be no rest period prior to the "penetration" game. If necessary, "penetration" games of 5 plays each team will be repeated until a winner is declared.
- b) After 80 minute games, a full 20 minute overtime game (not sudden-death) will be played as per Rule 5 of the Rule Book; there will be a 5 minute rest period before the game, unless both teams agree to shorten the rest period. If no winner is declared after the full 20 minutes, the teams will play "penetration" games of 5 plays each team if necessary, in the same manner described in a) above until a winner is declared.

MAJOR FOULS

A major foul will result in the immediate disqualification of the individual and/or team from the game plus any further automatic suspension as described in the Touch Bowl Policy and Procedures Manual (PPM). The final disqualification ruling will be dealt with by the Discipline Committee. Flagrant unsportsmanlike conduct towards an official will result in severe disciplinary action.

PERSONAL FOULS

Any game ejections resulting from personal fouls shall be treated as described in the PPM and may result in further suspensions. Continuous personal foul penalties will result in immediate disqualification from the tournament.

NOTE: A copy of the Football Canada Touch Bowl Policy and Procedures Manual will be available for reference throughout the tournament in the Touch Bowl Information Centre.
