## Touch Football Catches Fire

Many think of touch football as a sport for the recreationalist.

Anybody who does would probably run into a heated argument with someone who plays the game.

Touch football doesn't feature the contact as in tackle football, but what else can a retired player who is raising a family and holding down a steady job ask for.

The game is relatively injury free and the competitiveness and desire to win is there.

There are currently three leagues in New Brunswick — Saint John, Fredericton and Moncton. A three-member executive and six-member board of directors was recently formed.

"We're going to have some format designed next summer that'll see teams in Saint John, Fredericton and Moncton play each other," said Dave Sommerville, manager of Runner's World who copped the Saint John League championship Monday night.

The game of touch football isn't only the retired player of tackle football. Sommerville said of the 102 players registered in Saint John, there are

lawyers, school teachers, policemen, machinists and engineers.

Runner's World will take part in the Canadian championship in Ottawa Nov. 10-11. Moncton Dolphins will also be one of the 45 teams entered.

"I don't know how we'll do in the tournament but the Dolphins are ranked 17th," Sommerville said. "A team out of Halifax is seeded 16th."

While the talent to do well in national competition is available, Sommerville said a promotional campaign is required to get the sport off the ground.

Ten teams were registered with the Saint John League last year.

"About five of the teams were really keen on touch football and the keenest of them all met in the league final," he added. Runner's World defeated Labatt's Touchdown Club for the championship.

Sommerville said players for both clubs had a strong desire to play to win and represent the league in national competition.

"That was our goal from the start of the season."

The league has been in operation for three seasons and participation has been at a steady level of 100 players. One hun-

dred and two were registered this past season.

"We're going to start promoting the sport next Fall because it's all over for the season now," he said.

"We're going to approach the community centers and try and get more people playing. We'd like to have a league made up of two divisions."

Sommerville said the fan support teams currently get is made up mostly of wives, girlfriends and friends.

"We had a fairly good crowd for the championship game, but by going into the community centers we hope to get more people playing and others just out to watch."

He added: "It's exciting to watch and about the only injuries sustained are sprained ankles and thumbs."

A good many of the players are former high school and college players. Others are rugby players and then there are those simply out to enjoy the game.

Then there are those out for the recreational aspect.

"It's great for recreation and exercise," Sommerville said.

The recreational aspect of the game doesn't mean there's no particular style.

"It's not 'get the ball and run' sort of thing," Sommerville said. "The quarterback designs his plays and they are pretty well the same as tackle football except we only have seven players on the field at a time."

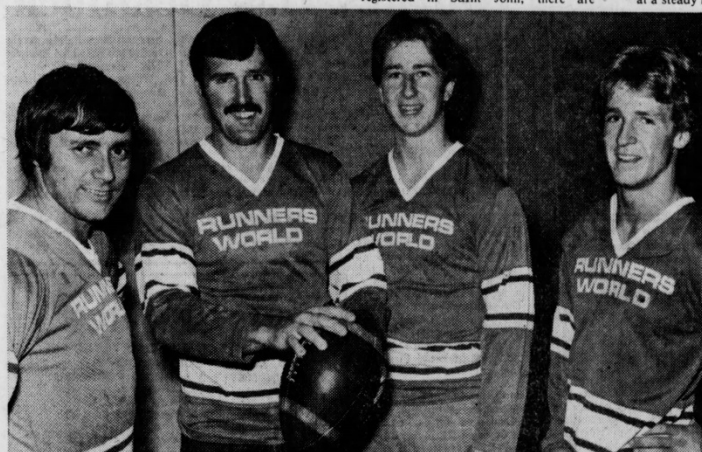
Touch football features a lot of movement and running and one of the players in the league of past experience who stands out is Kevin Carson who was a half back with Acadia University Axemen. He played for Labatt's Touchdown Club.

Another is Carson's teammate Cliff MacLeod who was an All-Canadian half back with Acadia.

Members of Runner's World are John Alcorn, Peter Breen, Mike Butler, Peter Cleaven, Ted White, Robbie Wilson, Darryl DeLong, Don Patterson, Rick Russell, Mike Grimmer and Garth McAdam, the league's top receiver and scoring champion.

Butler played for seven years with the Montreal Touchdown Club and has played five years of rugby in Saint John.

Sommerville predicts it won't be long before touch football really catches on in Saint John. "We have to really promote it next year. That means a lot of work."
