Touch Football Is Fun, Exciting

The ball has just been snapped from centre and the quarterback is scrambling in all directions looking for an open receiver. Oh no, he can't find one. Sweat generated from fear begins to pour down his face as over a dozen seconds have rolled by.

It's just about that time
. . . time when a
monstrous 280-pound
defensive lineman rolls in
and man-handles the QB
into the dirt.

But wait. There aren't any Mean Joe Greene's or Lee Roy Selmon's. Only a couple of guys ready to tag you on the back to end the play. It's a quarterback's dream!

Yes. It's also the Saint John Touch Football League. The little guy's league, the family man's league, the speedster's league, the anybody-who-wants-to-play's league. It is THE football league.

Thanks to Pat Palmer of the Saint John Recreation and Parks Department and a few others, the league was born in 1976 and has given the basic football-fanatic of Saint John a chance to play Terry Bradshaw or Lynn Swan for a day.

There are some who take the sport serious and are out to win all they can, but League president Dave Somerville said "there are others that say hey, let's go out tonight and have some fun and enjoy ourselves."

The league has expanded from eight teams its first season to 10 this year. Somerville pointed out that 185 players have registered for the 1980 campaign, the highest number ever, and he sees the possibility of the leage doubling its size for 1981.

"There's no reason why Saint John shouldn't have 13, 16 or even 20 teams in the league," he expalined. "It's an inexpensive sport. The only thing the players need is a pair of cleats."

The game's rules is a drawing card in itself. The only injury worries are possible muscle pulls and twisted ankles from running. Each team has even men on the 110-yard field with the defensive players having to touch the man with the ball with just one hand to halt action.

The defence lines six men a yard behind the line of scrimmage with one player, known around the loop as a rusher, five yards back. Nobody can cross the line of scrimage until after the rusher has.

On offense everybody is an eligible receiver, including the centre, after the ball has been snapped. Running plays can be used, but, as Somerville said, "90 per cent of the play is passing."

The games consist of 20-minute quarters with the first and third quarters straight time and the second and fourth straight time for the first 17

There is no blocking and Somerville, said, "everybody makes catches and everybody plays an important part."

The league has divided its 10 teams into two five-team Tiers. Tier A consists of the top five teams of 1979 — league champion Runner's World, 1880 Trojans, Labatt Blues, Kooler Kings and Fairvale Aces — while Tier B has the remainder — Walking Wounded, Surf City, Buccaneers, Raiders and new-entry Snyder's Photography.

A 13-game schedule is in effect with the squads battling their division rivals twice and their opponents from the opposite division once. The top four in each make the playoffs.

After a league winner is declared they will travel to Ottawa, Ont. for the national championships Nov. 7-9. Last year Runner's World posted an 0-2 record at the 56-team, double-knockout Canadian championship.

Both Moncton and Fredericton also have touch football leagues and will be sending their champions to Ottawa. This coming Sunday in Moncton, the Labatts provincial championship will be held between the league's three champions. The round-robin affair will see the top two advance to a sudden-death final.

"I've seen a marked improvement in the play over the last year," said Somerville of the local league. "We're improving in all aspects."

Maybe a national title isn't too far off, but for now, some Saint Johners are having the time of their life. They've got something the professionals only dream about.
