Jefferson puts a quick move on his coverage man and leaps high in the air, dragging the ball down with him as he crashes to the endzone turf.

## TOUCHDOWN, CHARGERS!

That's a scene which National Football League fans will witness many times this season in San Diego and, although the names and faces will be different, local football fans will see beginning Sunday when the Saint John Men's Touch Football League opens its 1981 season.

The touch football league is one which consists of swift runners, strong throwers and teams that live and die by the pass.

"A good 75 per cent of the game is passing," explaining league president Carl White. "It's a quick game and you rely a lot on speed."

The league, which was organized by the Saint John Recreation Department six years ago, was designed for passing.

There are no blitzing linebackers, no rugged rushing defensive line or formation set-running-backs to hand the ball off to.

All there really is, is one man, a rusher, who situates himself five yards behind the line of scrimmage and come after the signal caller once the ball has been snapped.

Each team sends seven players onto the field and the other six defensive men, along with the remaining six offensive performers, are scattered downfield, hoping the throw comes their way.

There are, at times, running plays because teams cannot live on pass alone.

But, when the chips are down, this league becomes an aerial circus.

"Overall," said White, "there is an awful lot of passing and offence."

The reason for this is simple according to White. Letting the ball ride through the air makes for exciting football and give everyone a shot at being the hero.

In 1980, Runner's World went the entire season unbeaten, tying once, and captured the provincial title for the second straight year to advance to the national championship.

This season they're expected to be as strong as ever with Mike Butler back at Quarterback and Tommy O'Reilly as his primary receiver.

Last year O'Reilly led the league in scoring and he's looking forward to accomplishing the same feat again.

"Mike Butler is outstan-

ding," explained White, who plays defence for the 1880 Trojans, the team which tied Runners' World in 1980. "He's a playmaker and calls all the shots."

Nine teams are entered in the loop this fall with two new squads stepping in and two old ones dropping out.

Runner's World, Trojans, Kooler Kings and new entry Thorne Riddell Rockets form Tier 'A' while the Buccaneers, Walking Wounded, Surf City, the Raiders and new entry Refinery Jets make up Tier 'B'.

The 'A' group consist of the better teams and the more seriously-minded players. Each club will play its division rivals twice and opponent in the other division once.

Top four in each Tier advance to the playoffs with the league champion travelling to Ottawa, Ont. for the national championship Oct. 30 to Nov. 2.

When the league first started there were 12 teams and although there are now only nine, White said the sport is not losing its popularity.

"It seems like there is a lot of interest, but you have to get people motivated," he said. "It's like everybody's waiting around for someone to make the first move."

If it's anything like the pass, this league will be expanding in no time.

In division "B" Walking Wounded are at the top with a 3-1 mark followed by the Buccaneers at 2-4, Raiders at 1-3, Shoppers Drug Mart at 1-4 and Irving Jets at 1-5.

One other contest last night saw Shoppers Drug Mart avenge a 6-0 loss to the Buccaneers on Sunday by thrashing the Bucs 30-0.

The Walking Wounded intercepted nine passes and its defence scored two touchdowns as they rocked the Trojans. Leading 14-12 at the half, the Wounded won the game in the fourth quarter when Bob Driscoll intercepted a Tom James pass and returned it 40 yards for the score.
